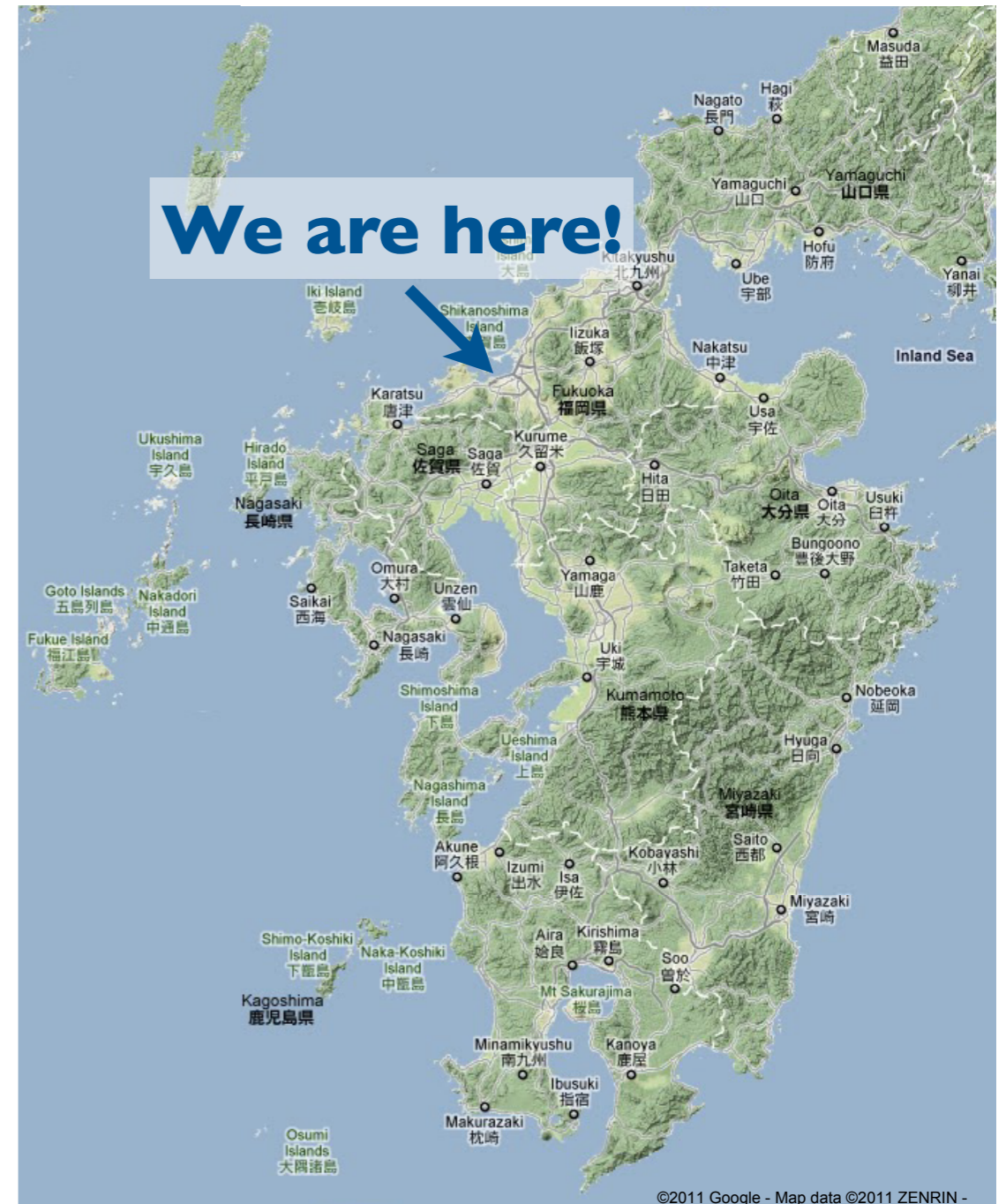
About KYUSHU and FUKUOKA



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Kyushu (九州)

- Kyushu is one of the 4 main islands in Japan (the 3rd largest in Japan; the 37th in the world).
- The name “Kyushu” comes from the 9 ancient provinces in the island between the 8 and 19 centuries (7 prefectures at present).
- There are many volcanoes and hot springs.
- Kyushu is the gateway for the Asian continent from ancient times.

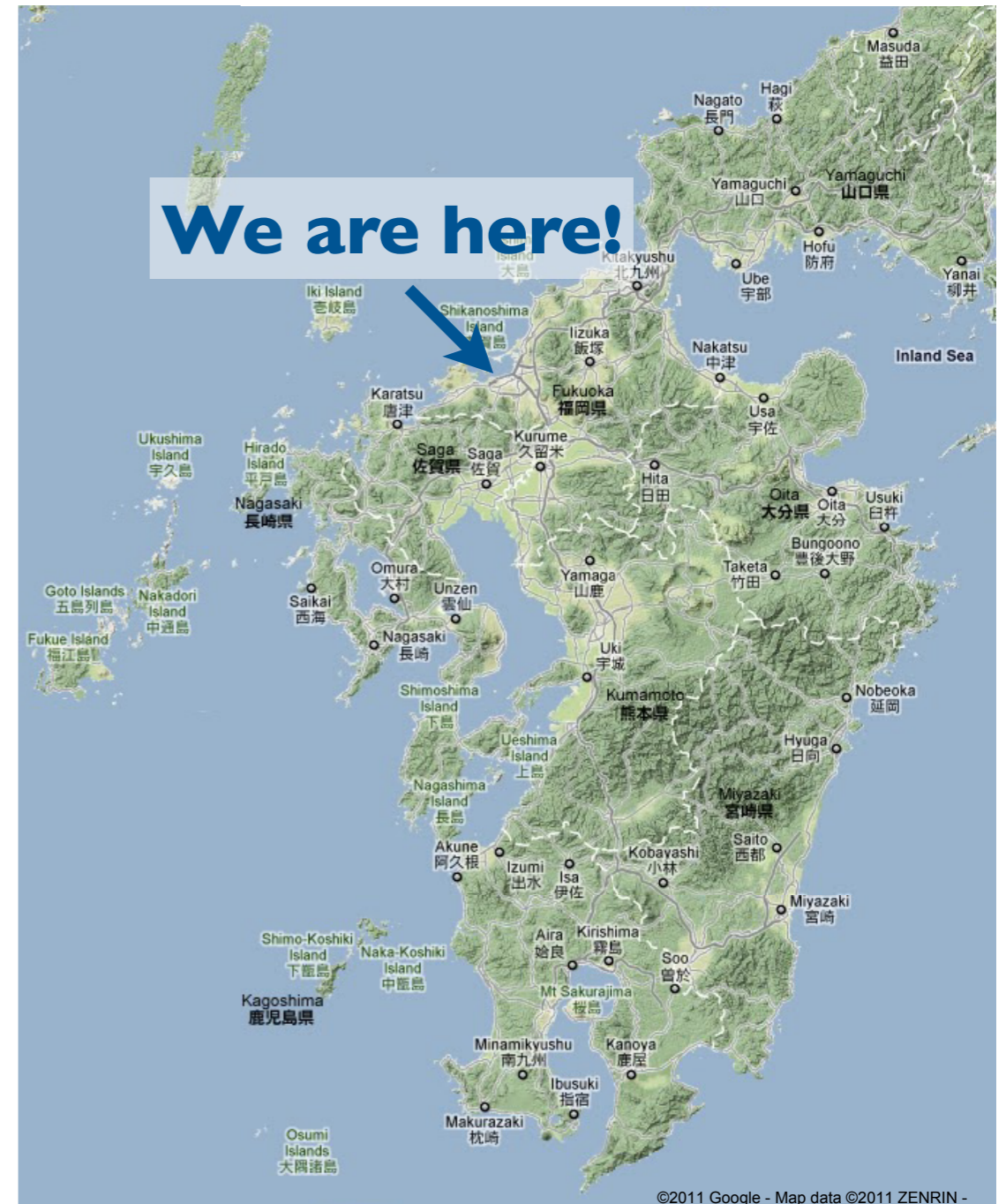


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Fukuoka (福岡)

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- In Dazaifu, 4km away from the workshop venue, an administrative agency for diplomacy and defense against foreign countries was established in the 7th century.

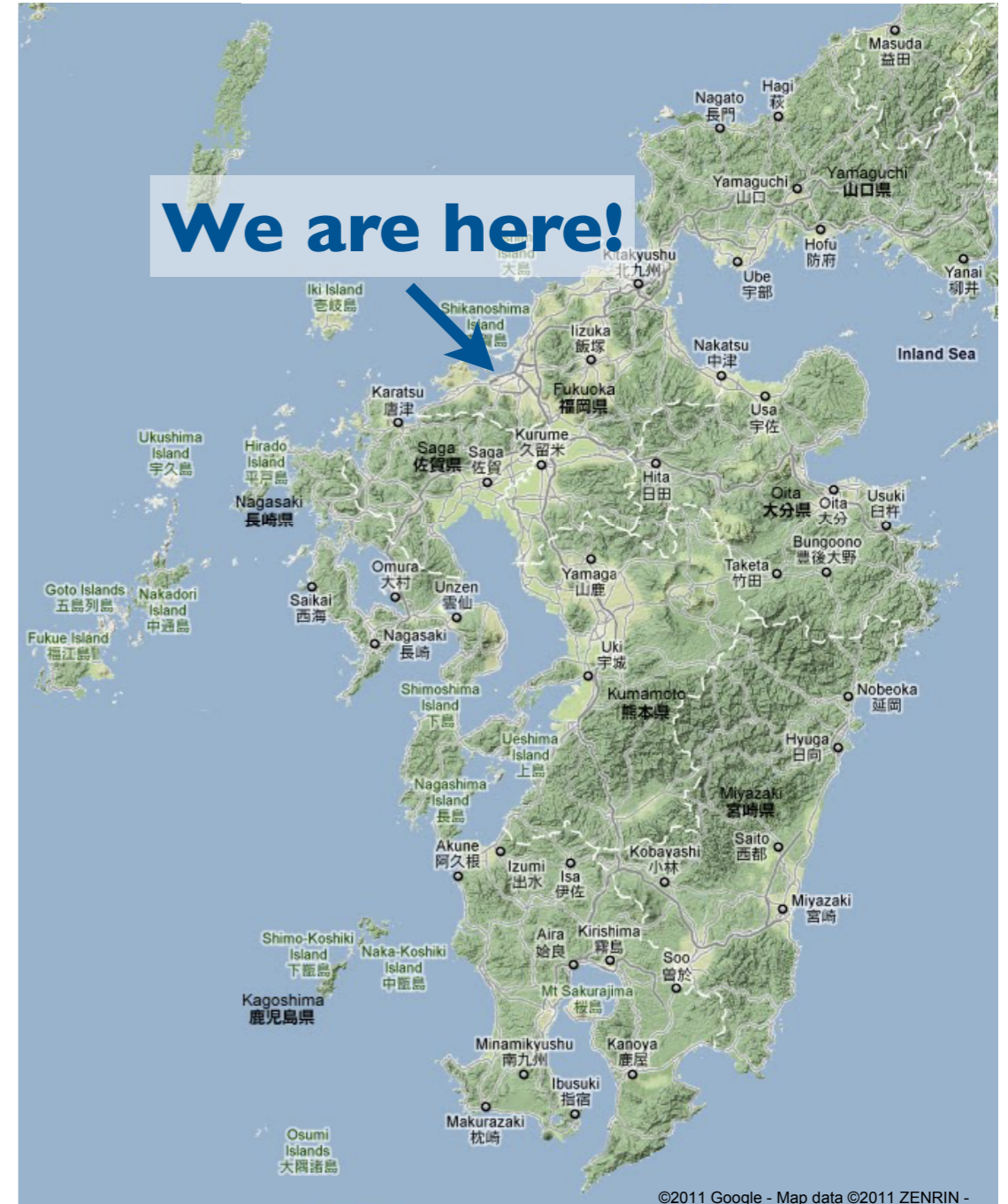


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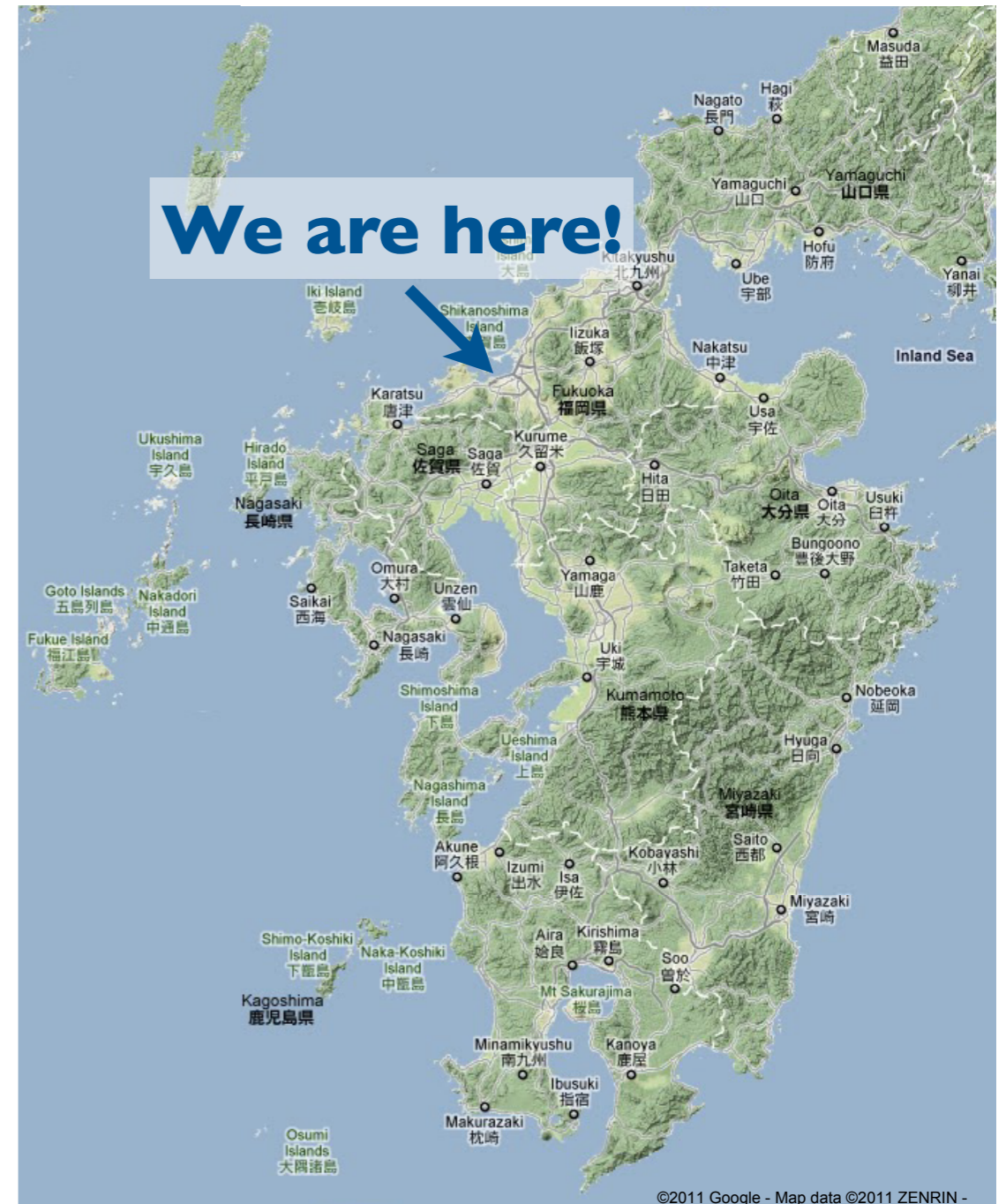


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- Hometown of Fukuoka SoftBank Hawks, a professional baseball team, a champion of the Pacific League both in 2010 and 2011 seasons.
